Do you have a Canadian mare that you'd like to breed?

Do you have a pregnant mare and are waiting for the birth of a foal?

Do you want to go into breeding? If yes, this information sheet is for you!

CHECK WITH THE STALLION OWNER!

Before entering into an agreement with a stallion owner, make sure they are aware of the following :

- ⇒ A **STALLION REPORT** (Form 007) must be completed at the end of the breeding season.
- ⇒ If the stallion was born in 2015, or after, he must have passed a **VETERINARY INSPECTION** (Form 008).

If these two things are not done, your foal will **NOT** be registrable.

REGISTERING THE FOAL

If the stallion owner submitted their year-end report, you will automatically receive a **BIRTH DECLARATION** (Form 003) by mail.

- 1 Complete the declaration and return it, along with your payment, to the address at the bottom of the form.
- You will then receive a **REGISTRATION KIT**, including the microchip, proof of parentage test (DNA kit), and the registration form.
- 2 Send the horsehair to the laboratory for DNA testing.
 - 3 With the help of your veterinarian, implant the microchip and complete the registration form.
 - 4 Return the registration form to the address listed at the bottom.

Congratulations! The process is now complete and you will get a **REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE** by mail.

BREEDING CONTRACT

Remember to define the terms of the agreement with the owner of the stallion you have chosen (e.g., payment, guarantees, distribution of costs, responsibilities, mare care if needed).

Ask for a **BREEDING CONTRACT** or, at the very least, **AN INVOICE WITH RECEIPT OF PAYMENT**. This will help you avoid misunderstandings and problems.

NAMING YOUR FOAL

The **FULL NAME** of your Canadian Horse has **three parts**:

- 1 Breeder's herd name.
- 2 Sire's name.
- 3 Horse's name, the first letter being defined by the year of birth.

The whole name must not exceed 30 characters, including spaces.

Don't have a herd name?

Get one today! (Form 011)

THE TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

Selling the foal? Do not forget to transfer the foal into the buyer's name.

By law, the **SELLER** is responsible for the transfer fees (\$35). To benefit from this rate, the **PURCHASER** must be a member of the CHBA for the current year (\$55).

Not sure how to deal with that? Simply add these amounts to your sale price.
